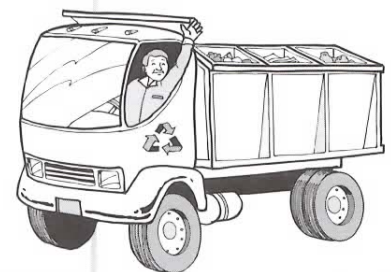
**GC:** Tam, what are your conservation strategies
