How to Make Saltwater Taffy

Saltwater taffy is easy to make. What isn't so easy on the other hand is trying not to eat it before it's finished! You will need these ingredients: 3 cups sugar, 1 cup water, 1 cup light corn syrup, 4 tablespoons butter, $1\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoons vanilla extract, and 1 teaspoon salt. It is helpful to use a candy thermometer. However, you can also check to see if the taffy is ready by dropping a small amount of it into cold water. If it forms a hard ball, it is ready.

Before you begin mixing the ingredients, butter a square pan. Combine the sugar, corn syrup, salt, and water in a 2-quart saucepan. Cook on low heat, stirring constantly until the sugar dissolves. Next, allow the mixture to cook for about 30 minutes or until the candy thermometer reaches 256° . Remember, you can try dropping a small amount into cold water to see if it forms a hard ball. Remove the saucepan from the stove. Be careful; it will be hot.

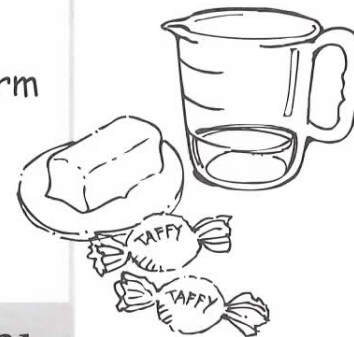
